

4-H Department

RULES:

1. Open to recognized members of a Napa County 4-H Club. 4-H members may enroll after they have entered Kindergarten and can exhibit as a member until the end of the calendar year in which the member turns 19 years of age.
2. Only exhibits which are made, collected or prepared by the exhibitor in accordance with the requirements or recommendations of that project program may be entered.
3. Exhibitors may make entries only in the unit in which they are currently enrolled or were enrolled in the immediately preceding 4-H Club year, but not both.
4. Entries which require packaging and labeling, such as food preservation and entomology, must be done in accordance with directions and recipes in project manuals and outlines.
5. Only standard containers specifically designed for the purpose will be accepted.
6. Entries completed not under official project status should enter in the Junior department.
7. All entries will be judged based on the **DANISH SYSTEM OF JUDGING** unless otherwise noted.
8. Items should be brought to the Fair on/in disposable containers, i.e. aluminum tins, cardboard cake forms, paper plates, etc. Do Not Bring items in or on something that you want returned.

4-H AWARDS

The following special awards will be presented to outstanding projects and/or Exhibitors for entries in the Napa Town & Country Fair. Winners list will be posted in Zinfandel Hall by 4:00 pm on August 14th. Winners of any Special Awards are encouraged to attend the Awards Program on Sunday, August 15th at 2:00 pm in the Livestock Show Arena.

Awards will be determined by a count of ribbons received in a certain division(s). The count will be as follows:

- 10 Points for each Best of Show
- 5 Points for each Blue Ribbon
- 3 Points for each Red Ribbon
- 1 Point for each White Ribbon

Exhibitors must have at least 2 entries in a category to be considered for a special award. An exhibitor can only receive one Special Award in the Junior & 4-H Departments only (other than livestock).

4-H Clothing Award - presented by the Soroptomist International of Napa.

4-H Linda Evans Memorial – presented by Mr. and Mrs. Robert McIntire to the outstanding 4-H Clothing or Home Furnishing exhibitor.

4-H Arts and Crafts Award – In memory of Harold Trathen, presented by Grace Methven.

4-H Foods Award - presented by the Napa County Farm Bureau.

4-H Agriculture/Horticulture Award - presented by Grace Methven.

4-H Miscellaneous Project (except photography) Award - presented by Joyce Trentacoste.

4-H William C. Joens Memorial Photography Award - \$25.00 will be presented to each of the two most outstanding photography entries. One will be awarded to a 4-H member ages 9 thru 13, the other will be awarded to a 4-H member ages 14 thru 18. Photographs must be a minimum size of 5" x 7" and must be matted and framed.

4-H Kim Atchley Memorial Award - presented for the Best 4-H Panel Display by Frank and Flora Atchley.

4-H or FFA Feature Booth Award - presented by Richard Brockmeyer of Wine Industry Investment Consulting.

4-H Country Store Award in Memory of Claire Del Santi and Janet Collins - presented for member and club participation by Grace Methven.

The Evelyn Botelho Memorial Outstanding Female and Male Exhibitor - presented by the 4-H County Council of Napa.

A plaque and \$50.00 will be presented to one boy & one girl in Junior or 4-H Divisions (other than livestock). Please note that this award may not be received by the same exhibitor two years in a row, i.e. an exhibitor who received this award in 2009 will not be eligible in 2010.

Cecil Herrick Award - The Napa Town and Country Fair is pleased to announce the 30th Annual Cecil Herrick Award; a special 4-H Club Sweepstakes Program. The Cecil Herrick Award is designed to encourage participation of 4-H members and 4-H groups at the Napa Town and Country Fair.

A total of \$200.00 in premium money will be paid to the 5 outstanding 4-H clubs, including \$60.00 to the 1st place club, \$50.00 for 2nd, \$40.00 for 3rd, \$30.00 going to the 4th place club, and \$20.00 being awarded for 5th place.

The scoring system and club tally sheet will be mailed to each community leader in mid-June. This will assist you in preparing your entries for the 2010 Napa Town and Country Fair.
